Ms. Martin requested Council's consideration for renewing the Township's two-year contract with the Library. It was noted that this year's request includes a 2% increase due to rising operational costs.

Councillor Lundy, Chair of the Parry Sound Public Library Board of Directors, expressed his appreciation to Ms. Martin, Ms. Fraser, and the entire Library staff for the services they provide to the community.

WHEREAS the Township has no settlement area and accompanying services and infrastructure within the South Archipelago; and

WHEREAS the CAO of The Township of The Archipelago established the framework to collaborate on affordable and attainable housing with neighbouring municipalities, senior levels of government and their agencies, OPP, DSSAB, etc.

WHEREAS successful communities with affordable and attainable housing have services available to residents including health services, recreational activities, food stores, fuel, etc; and

WHEREAS our effective businesses and service providers require workers and families that reside in our community; and

WHEREAS the Township acquired thirty-eight acres within our settlement area to proactively act on the needs of a sustainable community with affordable and attainable housing; and

WHEREAS the Township successfully initiated a management review and

visioning plan for Pointe au Baril facilities owned by the Township to effectively consider current and future community needs, requirements, and requests for added utility; and

WHEREAS the Township of The Archipelago settlement community requires a review of existing plans and new measures to ensure a long and successful future considering Hwy 69 becomes a secondary road or highway and the requirement to maintain a resilient and sustainable supply chain hub to North Archipelago.
